#### PERSONAL PROFILE – JANET STAINES

Only 4 weeks to go and I will have completed my studies and formation for Candidacy! As I near closer to this time I'm experiencing a sense of fulfilment and completion as this part of my ministry journey comes to end. Of course there is also a sense of anticipation about the future and wonderings about what will be different. Throughout the formation process I have had time to reflect on my ministry journey and the ways I have given myself to this call to ministry.



I think I would describe my sense of call as a 'brewing' rather than a sudden, striking realisation. I believe I am where I am today because I have at each

stage of my discipleship journey, responded to follow Christ the best way I know how, which has then led to the next moment of decision. Along the way my spiritual life has grown and developed so that each new situation has been understood from a new and deeper perspective.

Exploring ordination in the Uniting Church has highlighted my desire for a greater quality of 'being' in ministry and during my formation experience I have explored a much richer understanding of personhood. I have sought experiences to equip me to fulfil a call that is both for my own sake and for the sake of others.

I have found the writings of Ronald Rolheiser, *The Holy Longing* and *The Sacred Fire*, to be extremely helpful in developing a deeper human and Christian maturity. He explains that almost everything in our culture invites us to avoid tension and to resolve it whenever possible and we find it difficult to stay inside of unresolved tension. Carrying tension for the sake of God, love, truth and principle is a gestation process that transforms our tensions and gives birth to what is most noble inside us – compassion, forgiveness and love. I have found his work really helpful in managing the tension that William Willimon refers to in *Pastor*: "It is somewhat frightening to construe our lives in such a theonomous cast, to have our lives lived in constant reference to the purposes of God. But it is also invigorating to receive the freedom and the dissonance of living the called life in a world where too many people are answerable to nothing more than their own ill-formed desires... We are owned, commandeered for God, yoked to a manner of service wherein is perfect freedom."

Carrying the tension between being 'yoked' and being 'free', being faithful and being autonomous, is one that I am learning to carry and allowing God to birth in me a new way of *being* in ministry.



#### **NCLS**


Just a reminder about registering for the National Christian Life Survey (NCLS) which will be conducted in October. The information collected helps congregations and also helps the Presbytery and Synod with important information for future planning. I would like to encourage each congregation to register.

Just to note that the Synod is paying the registration cost (\$250) for every congregation.

So if your congregation has less than 30 people there is no cost. If your congregation is over 30 people then the cost is only \$1.50 per person. Either way the cost will be minimal for the congregation and will help your planning and the planning of the wider church. Further information is in the letter from the General Secretary sent to all congregations in early April or see Uniting News for how to order the surveys

Mike Endicott became blind in his mid-forties. He had discovered through sad experience that most people who are prayed for do not recover. Then, through the crisis of a friends death, came the discovery that he had been focusing on healing instead of obeying Christ's command to proclaim the kingdom of God as the place where healing happens, and so let Christ the Healer be present. As a result of this he has been thrilled to begin to see most people being prayed for healed - some instantly, others step by step, and some gradually.

Mike is an Anglican minister and is now the Prior of the healing order called the Order of Jacob's Well (UK) developing a series of ecumenical healing groups throughout the United Kingdom. Each is led by a respected lay person made up of members derived from local denominational churches. Their task is to learn how to focus on Christ the Healer through a DVD series, study and practice together, and then provide opportunities for healing services in the congregations throughout the local area.



In 2015, as a result of seeing his own neighbor healed of leukemia after reading and applying the principles from Mike's book "The Blind Healer", Rev Professor Dean Drayton committed to become a Prior of the Order Jacob's Well (Australia) and is currently assisting in the introduction of the Order and establishment of "wells" in Australia.

To support this, three representatives of the Order of Jacob Well (UK) are coming to Australia to provide public teaching, information, learning about healing, all culminating in a healing service in the center of three cities. In Adelaide, at St Peters Cathedral 17-19 June, in Sydney at St Stephens Church on 1-3 July and in Brisbane at St Andrews Church 1-3 July.
